What do you think of your Grandparents?

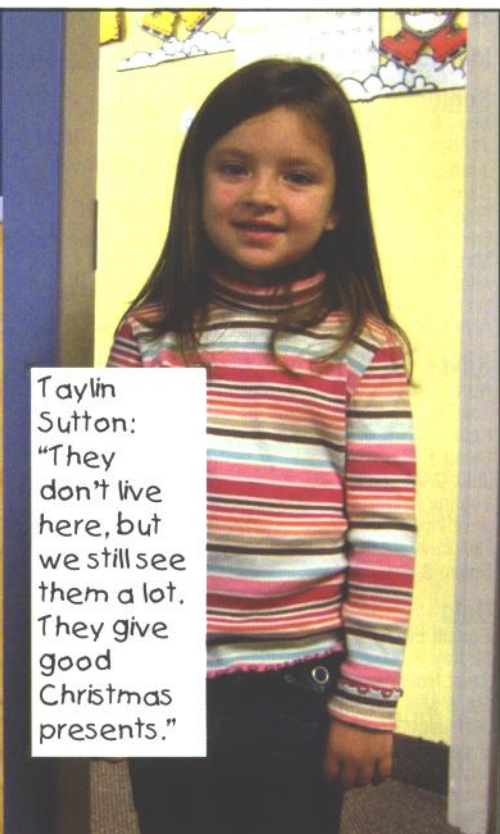

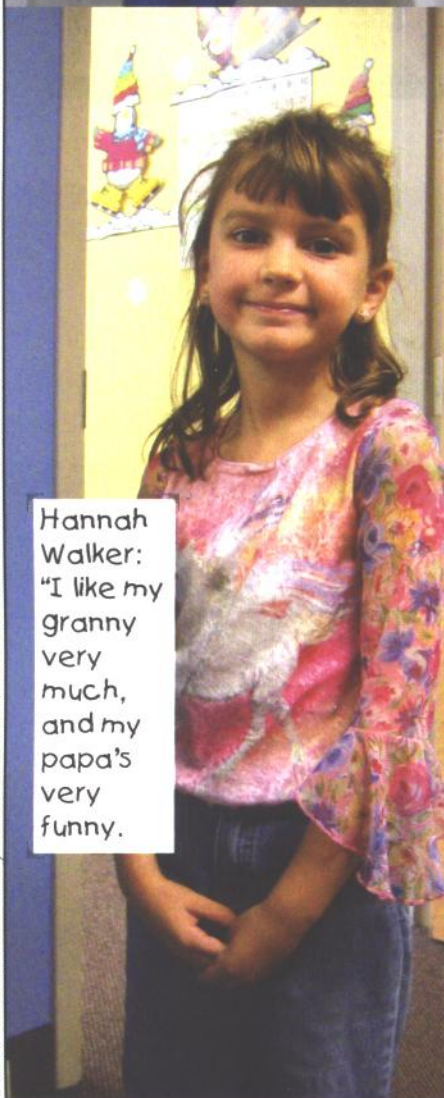
Isabell Guerra:

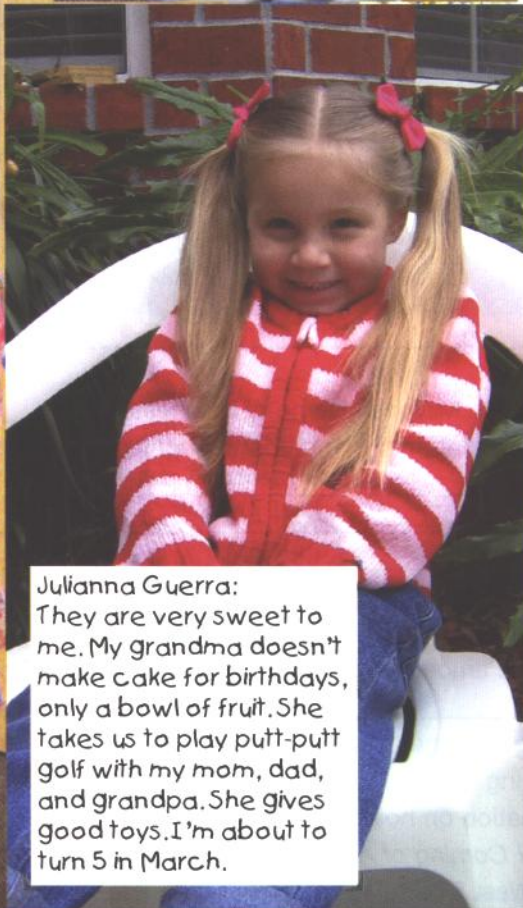
Nya Bell:
My grandma lives here in town; I like it when I get to see her."



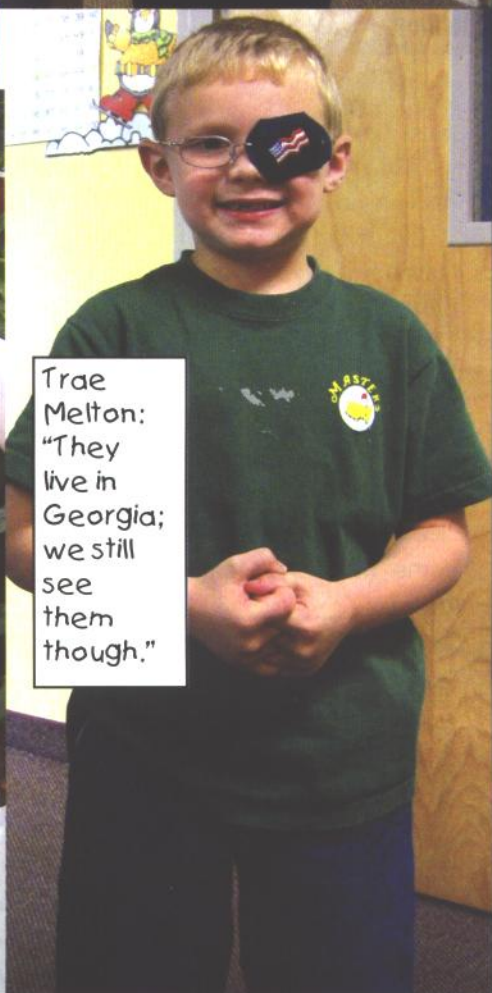
Taylin Sutton:
